Yoon Visits U.K; Touts on Indo-Pacific Security



South Korean President Yoon Suk Yeol was on a three-day State Visit to the United Kingdom on Nov. 21,2023. He basked in the glory of a grand procession, seated beside King Charles III in a majestic carriage, flanked by the elite royal guard. During his historical visit he addressed the U.K. parliament, and stated, "Korea will work with the United Kingdom to bolster the political and economic security in the Indo-Pacific region." Both countries seek to enhance their digital, A.I., cyber security, nuclear energy, defense, and maritime security cooperation. Additionally, green energy, outer space, and semiconductors are the areas of potential partnership as both countries plan to unveil £21 billion in investments for green energy and infrastructure projects.

In moving forward to strengthen trade and investment, Korea and the U.K intend to modernize the Free Trade Agreement (FTA) that took place in 2021. He also mentioned that the United Kingdom was the first European nation to sign the *Treaty of Friendship and Commerce* with Korea in 1883 and that this year marks the 140th Anniversary of establishing diplomatic ties between the two countries, a significant milestone in their shared history. It is worth mentioning that leaders from both sides of the aisle in parliament joined the President to commemorate the service and honor of 80,000 British Armed Forces soldiers who fought alongside their Korean allies during the Korean War as this year marks the 70th anniversary of the Korean War Armistice Agreement.

President Yoon and British Prime Minister Sunak held a bilateral summit, signing the <u>Downing Street Accord</u> to elevate the 'Global Strategic Partnership' between the United Kingdom (UK) and the Republic of Korea (ROK). As per the agreement, the two countries will

work together to strengthen an open and resilient international order, promote a rules-based economic system, and ensure a sustainable future. Furthermore, both leaders have agreed to launch a 2+2 Foreign and Defense Ministerial meeting. Read More

Beijing Conducts Military Drill Along Myanmar Border

China has <u>initiated military drills</u> along the northern border of Myanmar. Since October, ethnic groups-led joint forces have launched aggressive attacks resulting in the capture of several posts, towns, and military installations. The U.N. has <u>reported</u> that over 200,000 people have been displaced due to the violence. The continued conflict and resistance force's actions are becoming increasingly concerning for the security of Chinese companies and entities operating in Myanmar. China has <u>invested in several projects</u> in Myanmar under the Border Road Initiative (BRI), including a rail project and the Myanmar-China Economic Corridor in Shan province, which have been deeply affected by the conflict. <u>Read More</u>

India-Australia Holds 2+2 Ministerial Meeting

India and Australia <u>called</u> its annual 2+2 Defence and Foreign Ministerial Dialogue in New Delhi on Nov. 20, 2023. Both countries started this crucial dialogue in 2021 to enhance the Comprehensive Strategic Partnership. The joint statement stated that frequent high-

level contacts and ministerial visits have strengthened the relationship between India and Australia. Both countries have expanded their ties into various areas, including defense and security, trade and investment, education and research, agriculture, and water, cyber and space, mining and critical minerals, climate change and renewable energy, people-to-people links, and mobility of people. South Korea-Japan-China Foreign Ministers Meet

South Korea's Park Jin, Japan's Yoko Kamikawa, and China's Wang Yi met in Busan, South Korea, to normalize the relationship between the three countries. This meeting occurred long after 2019, and relations between the three East Asian countries have not been smooth. Furthermore, in recent times, China has imposed a ban on seafood imported from Japan. However, Kishida and Xi met in person on the sidelines of the APEC summit in San Francisco this month. It is noted that Japan and South Korea are the key partners of the U.S. strategy in the Indo-Pacific, and the three countries elevated their trilateral partnership with the Camp David Agreement in August 2023.
