### Year 2023, "Decisive Year" in the Indo-Pacific Region-DoD

In a report <u>released</u> by the Pentagon, U.S. Defense Secretary Austin said, "In this decisive decade, 2023 will be remembered as a decisive year for implementing U.S. defense strategy in Asia." Counting on working with allies and partners, the U.S. has delivered "groundbreaking achievements for peace, stability, and deterrence in support of a free and open Indo-Pacific region." The Pentagon report further states that the U.S. regional force posture has transformed to more mobile, distributed, resilient, and lethal in the region by deploying military units in Japan, visits of submarines, and rotation of fighters & bombers to Australia. Moreover, it strengthened the defense cooperation with the Philippines and Papua New Guinea. The report highlights strengthening capabilities by investing in the India-U.S. Defense Acceleration Ecosystem (INDUS-EX) and industrial defense cooperation with India, Australia, and Japan.

The report further emphasizes that the U.S. has operated with allies and partners in multiple ways, e.g., capacity building and training programs in the ASEAN countries and multilateral high-range military exercises to advance a shared vision of establishing peace and security in the region. <u>Read More</u>

#### India's EAM Visits Russia

India's Foreign Minister visited Russia from December 25-29. In a <u>release by the Ministry of External Affairs</u>, three documents are signed, "relating to the Kudan Kulam Nuclear Power Plants, an MoU on cooperation in pharmaceuticals and healthcare and a Protocol on Foreign Office Consultations." He also exchanged views on bilateral relations, regional developments, and multilateral cooperation. He also met with the Russian Deputy Prime Minister, the Foreign Minister, and the Ministry of Trade and Industry. Furthermore, President Putin extended the invitation to Prime Minister Modi to visit Moscow this year. It is worth mentioning that historically, India and Russia have strong defense and strategic relations, and Moscow has been a 'timetested friend.' As per <u>the report</u>, Russia is still India's largest arms supplier. <u>Read More</u>

# North Korea's Kim Vows to Boost National Defense in 2024

North Korean leader Kim Jong Un vows to boost reconnaissance and nuclear capabilities to bolster its national defense to prepare for the "U.S.-led confrontation". He aspires to develop more military spy satellites, nuclear materials, and attack drones to reinforce his strategy against hostile countries. According to the <u>reports</u>, Kim said, "Because of reckless moves by the enemies to invade us, it is a fait accompli that a war can break out at any time on the Korean Peninsula," speaking in the ruling party meeting to set economic, military, and foreign policy goals in 2024. <u>Read More</u>
