Indian Ocean Island Nation Comoros Announces New President

Comoros incumbent President and ex-military leader Azali Assoumani has been elected for a fourth-year term of President in the elections held on Jan.14. As per media reports he secured 63% of the vote amid the lower turnout and the boycott from the opposition. On contrary, "international poll observers have said that voting was largely free and fair despite the irregularities reported by the opposition."

Comoros is an Indian Ocean state <u>comprising three semi-autonomous islands</u>- Grande-Comore, Anjouan, and Moheli. It is located north of the Mozambique Channel and was a French colony until 1975. The Comoros archipelago has been vital in the Indian Ocean since the pre-colonial era. It was a crucial node in the maritime trade networks connecting the Middle East, India, and eastern African regions. The islands' strategic location made them an essential stopover for traders and travelers crossing the ocean. As a result, Comoros became a melting pot of cultures, with influences from Africa, Arabia, Persia, and India. Comoros is the member of Indian Ocean Rim Association (IORA), a leading intergovernmental organization of Indian Ocean region, established in 1997.

The United States and Comoros established diplomatic relations in 1977. The U.S. embassy in Madagascar accredited to Comoros during this time. In February 2023, the two countries signed an agreement known as the U.S.-Comoros Joint Statement on Cooperation. The deal sets shared goals for regional and global peace, prosperity, security, and stability. Read More

Five Eyes Top Defense Officials Meets

The U.S. Principal Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Indo-Pacific Security Affairs met with his counterparts in Singapore. As per the <u>readout</u>, during the meeting, senior officials discussed ways to

strengthen regional security and uphold the rules-based international order. They emphasized the importance of promoting air and maritime operational safety in the Indo-Pacific region. Furthermore, they reaffirmed the significance of continuing to collaborate in order to enhance the collective resilience of all partners in the region and build resilience across the broader Indo-Pacific area.

Myanmar's Conflict and Security situation: A Conversation with Ambassador Derek Mitchell

On February 1, 2021, a coup d'état took place in Myanmar that saw the military regime take control of the government. This resulted in the arrest of numerous political leaders and civilians, leading to widespread civil unrest and resistance against the military ruler, Min Aung Hlaing. The resistance alliance, made up of three opposition groups, has been escalating their efforts against the military regime and has managed to gain control of critical areas in Myanmar. The ongoing conflict in Myanmar has been a major concern for regional security, as it has the potential to impact the entire region. The conflict has resulted in a humanitarian crisis, with thousands of people being displaced and facing food and medical shortages.

The international community has condemned the military coup and imposed sanctions on the military regime to pressure them to return power to the democratically elected government. However, the military regime has shown little sign of backing down, and the conflict in Myanmar continues to escalate, with no clear end in sight. On the question of China's role in mediating the conflict and a long-term ally of military regime the former Ambassador of Myanmar Derek Mitchell said, "there's not a lot of trust in between China and Myanmar and even the military regime. They have had a meeting over the years, a kind of a
