# U.S. CEOs' Visit China, Hopes for Improved U.S.-China Relations

China's President Xi Jinping held a meeting with several American business leaders and Academics who recently visited China. Xi seeks better economic relations to build upon an opportunity to boost China's declining economy. Some of the prominent figures at the meeting included Stephen Schwarzman from Blackstone, Cristiano Amon from Qualcomm Inc., and Raj Subramaniam of FedEx (FDX)

China is keen to explore ways to revitalize its economy, attract more investments from the United States, and improve bilateral relations. During the meeting, XI said, "The relationship cannot go back to the old days, but it can embrace a brighter future Prospects."

The <u>U.S.-China Business council</u> said, "USCBC was honored to be invited to participate in the dialogue with President Xi to discuss our concerns over the decline in trade, investment, and business confidence, as well as our desire to help improve engagement and commercial exchange between our two countries."

It's worth noting that China is currently experiencing an economic downturn, and its <u>debt-to-GDP ratio hit a record high of 288% in 2023</u>. Additionally, the International Monetary Fund has <u>predicted that China will barely miss its target of 5% GDP growth in 2024</u>, with an estimated growth rate of only 4.6%. The IMF also expects this growth rate to further decline to 3.5% by 2028. International investors have lacked confidence due to excessive scrutiny.

U.S.-China ties have stabilized after Xi -Biden summit in San Francisco in November 2023 on the sideline of the APEC summit. Postleaders meeting, there has been positive developments on resumption on military-to-military communication and cooperation on <u>counternarcotics</u>. However, they continue to dispute various geopolitical, cybersecurity, and trade issues. Recently, the U.S. has taken a series of actions against APT 31, a cyber threat group. It has imposed new visa restrictions on multiple Hong Kong officials responsible for the intensifying crackdown on rights and freedoms, as per the Hong Kong Policy Act Report. Moreover, China's assertiveness in the South China Sea and heightened tensions with the Philippines in maritime territorial disputes have put the U.S.-Philippines defense agreement to the test, as the U.S. is committed to maintaining a free and open Indo-Pacific region. During a recent call to China's Vice Foreign Minister Ma Zhaoxu, Deputy Secretary Campbell emphasized the significance of preserving peace and stability in the South China Sea, across the Taiwan Strait, and on the Korean Peninsula. He also expressed concerns regarding China's assistance to the Russian defense industry.

Taiwan is a flash point in U.S.-China relations, and China claims it as a breakaway province. The U.S. recently pledged \$300m in military aid to Taiwan and sent a <u>bipartisan congressional delegation led by Rep.</u>

<u>Jack Bergman</u> to demonstrate its continued support.

Given the current state of affairs between the United States and China, assessing the investment flow from the former to the latter has become quite complex. The ongoing tensions, particularly in the realm of international trade and technology have created an environment that is

not exactly conducive to foreign companies, making it difficult for them to operate in China. Read More

### Japan Concludes Pacific Islands Defense Dialogues

Japan <u>held</u> a ministerial-level defense meeting with Pacific Island nations in Tokyo. The representatives from the fourteen island countries attended the dialogue. Japan has expanded its partnership with Pacific Island countries, viewing China's increasing influence in the Pacific. With his counterparts, Japanese Defense Minister Minoru Kihara underscores the importance of a <u>free and open maritime-based rule of law</u>. Andrew Winternitz, the U.S. acting deputy assistant secretary of defense (A/DASD) for East Asia, attended the meeting. He stated, "This dialogue marked an important opportunity to connect with a wide range of Pacific Island partners and exchange views on shared defense and security issues in the region." <u>Read More</u>
